

## **OVERVIEW OF DRIVE-IN RACKS**

Drive-in racking creates a cost-effective, high density storage system that allows storage of pallets multiple positions deep, reducing the space required for aisles.

Drive-in racks are designed to store pallets in a different way that other racks. Horizontal planes are designed using rails that allow the pallet edges to be supported, while allowing clear tunnels to be created as each pallet is removed. This permits the forklift to penetrate into the racks further and further as the front pallets are picked.

There are two types of drive-in racks: drive-in and drive-thru. Drive-in racks either have a stopper at some point or are placed against a wall. Drive-thru racks allow the forklift to actually drive completely through the racks once enough pallets have been picked. There are specific reasons for designing each of these systems.

Drive-in racks are best for operations where there are larger numbers of pallets per sku. An ideal scenario would be a product that is made in a batch that has enough pallets to fill a bay. The pallets may then be picked as an entire batch, or individually, as needed. Ideally only one SKU is stored per bay.

## ADVANTAGES OF DRIVE-IN RACK CONFIGURATION

- Highly efficient pallet storage,
- The number of aisles is greatly reduced resulting in greater space optimization,
- Load rails constructed of durable structural angle steel.
- Cost-effective storage strategy,
- Almost unlimited depth in terms of the number of pallets,
- No specialized MHE (forklifts) are required,
- Greater density than any other storage system.



Drive-in racks are serviced by stand up "reach" trucks or many different types of three or four wheel "counterbalance" trucks.











## STANDARD SIX DEEP DRIVE-IN CONFIGURATION




The depth of drive-in or drive-thru racks is highly variable, from two pallets up almost any depth, but usually not exceeding fifteen or twenty pallets.





# DISADVANTAGES OF DRIVE-IN RACK CONFIGURATION

- Lowest selectivity of any storage system,
- Lift trucks may damage racks if guide rails are not installed along the floor or attached to the tunnel sides,
- It is a LIFO system, not well adapted to stock rotation,
- Typically only 60 70% of the storage capacity is used at any given time,
- It is substantially more expensive that standard selective racks,
- It is custom designed to your application, and therefore has almost no resale value when it is being disposed of, except for scrap metal.


